

PE Premium Funding- Impact and Sustainability Summary 2016-17

This document is to reflect on the impact and the sustainability of last year's spending of the PE Pupil Premium funding.

Initiative	Cost	Impact
Arena Membership including:	£400	Becoming a member of the ARENA network provides training, courses for CPD, the South West PE conference, planning, assessment, PGL training and bikeability.
Bikeability		The use of bikeability has allowed the children to ride their bikes to school safely and has promoted a healthy lifestyle in allowing them to do so.
Courses for CPD		The PE leader was able to attend the PE conference at the beginning of the year to continue their CPD and bring back to the school any new ideas to enhance PE in school. NQT's were able to attend a gymnastics workshop to develop their CPD.
Playground leaders		Children in year 6 have been given the opportunity to build their leadership skills from the training that is provided by ARENA. The children took part in the training of learning different playground activities and how to plan and deliver them in the playground. This has encouraged children to be more active in the playground.
Planning		The planning from ARENA has given all teaching staff easy to follow planning for each stage of their PE lessons. This has increased staff's confidence to teach different sports and games in PE and allows them to following planning that builds on skills from the specific sports.
Assessment		The Bronze, Silver, Gold assessment strategy provided by ARENA has given all staff a clear and easy strategy to be able to assess all the children in their class in each area of PE and games. This has also meant that the PE coordinator can easily access the assessments to analyse and interpret the data.
Football coach for Year 6 for 6 weeks of curriculum time plus afterschool club	£90 p/w	Using the coaching for curriculum time has allowed the teachers to observe high quality football lessons. They have been able to see how a football lesson should be split into skill based training and game time and also been able to see different drills and games for all the different ability children. This is now being used in their lessons this year.
Wild tribe training and resources.	£500	Last year, one member of staff was trained in delivering Wild Tribe. This has meant that this year we have been able to take advantage of this training and the resources by having all year groups experience at least one day of Wild Tribe. From verbal feedback of the children this has been a great success so far.

More Year 5 swimmers are independent and more competent.</p>

Argyle- Y3,4,5 and 6 all year Tag rugby- Y3 and 4 Spring 1 Basket ball- Y5 and 6 Spring 2 Dance– Spring Yoga– Summer Cricket - Summer Y3/4 then 5/6</p>	<p>£2500</p>	<p>This has allowed for more space for participants which means we have more active children who have developed a passion for sport and want to continue the extracurricular clubs this year.</p> <p>Clubs have been maintained this year from the monitoring of which clubs were the most popular and most enjoyed by the children.</p> <p>These variety of clubs have allowed all children that wanted to, join at least one club throughout the year. We are aiming each year for 75% participation rates in extracurricular sports clubs.</p>
<p>Allow opportunity for participation in competitive sport</p>	<p>£1 per member for cross-country races</p>	<p>Engagement has developed in competitive sports (inter and intra) and has been fostered within the school ethos and children look forward to the events each year. Children are always asking about 'Landrake Run' or if they can join the other clubs on offer, especially Field gun. The children have a great desire and interest to do the activities on offer and are willing to complete against other schools.</p>
