Strike Action

I am sure you are aware of the strike action that has taken place by nurses, postal workers and rail workers, following ballots organised by their trade unions. The teaching staff who are members of the NEU union have decided, in line with the ballot result from their union, that strike action is necessary for changes to be made to the education system. This action is not against the school itself, but is part of national industrial action organised by these trade unions about their members' pay and the dispute with the Secretary of State for Education.

Neither the Governing Body nor the Head Teacher is legally allowed to close the school 'in sympathy' with the strike. However, our main concern is the safety of our children. The school may only close if, in the opinion of the Head Teacher, it is not safe to remain open, because so many teachers will be absent that it would not be possible to provide adequate levels of supervision.

There is no requirement on unions to inform the school of which members of staff will take strike action. There is also no obligation on members of unions to obey a strike call. However, Carbeile Junior School teaching staff have indicated in advance that there will be a significant number of teachers taking part in strike action.

Based on this information, I consider that it will not be safe to open on this day. **Therefore, Carbeile will be closed to pupils all day on Wednesday 1 February**. Staff have been instructed not to set cover work on this day, by their trade unions, as part of the industrial action. It is extremely important to note that the teachers have not made this decision lightly, we have had multiple discussions about the options available, but ultimately they are all standing up for what they believe in, which I respect, and I hope you understand.

The school will be closed to all children. However, if there is absolutely no way that you can provide care for your child on Wednesday 1st February, then you will need to email me with the reason for this and we will aim to accommodate you as much as we can.

I hope you understand the reasons for this strike, and that you can support our staff in trying to make a change in education.

Pantomime - Goldilocks and the Three Bears

I have been in talks with the Theatre Royal, Plymouth about getting cheaper tickets to see their 2023 pantomime, Goldilocks and the Three Bears. My family and I were lucky enough to see Sleeping Beauty last week and I would love to offer this opportunity to all of our children. Unfortunately we cannot do this as a school trip as the cost of the coaches would prohibit us going. Therefore, I have managed to secure something a bit different.

I would like to offer out the cheaper rate tickets to the community, so that if you and your children would like to see the pantomime but have always been put off by the price, we can make the most of a school booking to enable our children to experience

live theatre. This means you can buy as many tickets as you want for your family, friends, relatives etc.

I have provisionally booked 500 tickets in the stalls, circle and upper circle, with tickets usually around the £35 mark. The Theatre Royal have very kindly agreed to make the children's tickets £10, and all other adult tickets £20. This reduces a family of four price from around £140 to £60.

If you are interested in this, a letter will be coming out soon for you to book however many tickets you would like, and then to send the money in at the same time so your tickets are booked. Remember, you can book for family and friends, even if they don't go to Carbeile.

I think this is a wonderful opportunity to see an amazing performance at a greatly reduced price.

Road Safety

Highlighted by the crazy behaviour in trying to get 'Prime' from Spar at the end of the day, there have been some near misses on the road recently. We will be doing some extensive work on road safety in the coming weeks.

Reading

Linked to the Home Learning section above, please try and prioritise reading for pleasure at home so that your children really enjoy picking up a book and reading. If you can, try and make time to read with your child and actually question them on any vocabulary that they might not have heard before. This will develop their reading fluency, but also their understanding of different vocabulary.

It is proven that children who are subjected to lots of 'words' at home are much more successful readers and writers, whether that is by just being spoken to, or by being read to, or simply reading themselves. So give your children the best possible reading experience at home by letting them read to you at least three times a week, and then questioning them about their book at the same time. Thank you for your support in this.

Cornwall Air Ambulance

It has been announced that the Cornwall Air Ambulance is doing a fund raiser on Friday 10th February. They would love it if all schools across Cornwall took part by dressing in red and donating money to the charity to keep this amazing facility going. Home Learning

As you know, your children work extremely hard in the 7 and a half hours that they are in school each day. It is exactly for this reason that we do not set excessive amounts of home learning. However, if you are able to support and encourage the children to read at least three times every week (every day if possible) and to complete at least 10 minutes on Times Tables Rock Stars every week, that would be amazing. We do not ever punish children for not completing home learning, though we do remind them to do their best to complete it, and we do reward children with bonus Golden Time if they do complete the reading and the times tables.

Eco Tip of the Week


Recycling


