You are obviously very aware that the school has gone through a large rebranding exercise, resulting in new uniform, a new logo, new values and a new vision. It has also posed problems when having to replace everything that has our old logo on. One such update needed is the sail flags that we take

to the cross country events, and the ones we use for our assemblies and sports day. We use a company in Penzance for our sail flags, and we would like to ask if there is anyone who would like to sponsor one of these flags. I asked two parents during the cross country event and they seemed keen. **The cost of one flag would be £50 and we would of course add your business name to the bottom of it.** All flags are made from recycled PET bottles. Up to 60% are reclaimed from the ocean, beach clean ups and the fishing industry. The rest come from recycling centres. These pet bottles are broken down and then made into polyester yarn.
