# Year 6 SATs Data

We have pleasure in enclosing a full breakdown of Carbeile Junior School's achievements in this year's national curriculum tests (SATs) for Reading, GPS (English Grammar, Punctuation and Spelling) and Maths, which the children sat in May, as well as a moderated teacher assessment for writing.

We would like to draw your attention to the school's headline data:

Writing	79%	72%	12%	12%
GPS	74%	72%	30%	31%
Maths	82%	73%	21%	23%
Combined: Reading, Writing, Maths	66%	61%	5%	7%

As you can see, as a school we have performed better than the national averages in all areas, and we are significantly above the national standard in Reading, Writing and Maths – this is exceptional. 66% of our year 6 children achieved the expected standard in Reading, Writing and Maths combined (compared to a national average of 61%).

Although our greater depth statistics are in line with the national stats, the national ones are currently estimates apparently, though they are unlikely to be changed hugely.

The SATs results are not always a fair assessment of some children's learning (and some children might have missed the 'pass mark' by a single mark) so if you would like further information about your child's SATs scores, please do not hesitate to contact me.

As a parent, we want you to be reassured that this Year 6 cohort have been a true credit to the school and to their parents. Their attendance at booster sessions has been the best for years, their effort in lessons has largely been outstanding, and we are so proud of everything they have achieved.
